Legal concerns and potential liabilities continue to have a major impact on the success (if not the survival) of magazines. On May 23, 1996, ASME will present its latest seminar on recent legal developments facing magazine editors. Our speaker will once again be Lawrence Savell, Counsel in the New York office of the law firm Chadbourne & Parke LLP.

Mr. Savell advises and represents clients on matters including libel, privacy, First Amendment, trademark, copyright, contract, negligence, and products liability. He serves on the Communications and Media Law Committee of the Association of the Bar of the City of New York, and on the New York State Bar Association Media Law Committee. He has written over 100 legal articles for a wide variety of professional and mass-market publications, and currently serves as legal editor and columnist for *Car Collector* magazine.

In an up-to-date, practical, and non-legalese presentation, Mr. Savell will discuss a broad range of issues including the following:

- 1. Potholes in the "Information Superhighway": On-line concerns such as ownership of electronic rights to articles by free-lancers, with analysis of standard and innovative contractual language;
- Developments in libel law, including lessons from recent massive court judgments;
- 3. Recent key invasion of privacy decisions;
- 4. Significant new rulings in copyright and trademark law relevant to the magazine business (including "fair use");
- 5. Potential limits of editorial discretion and revision; and
- 6. Products liability claims against publishers: can a magazine or article be a defective product?

Questions will be welcome throughout the presentation as well as afterwards, encouraging open and informal discussion and interaction. An extensive handout will be provided, addressing in greater detail many of the subjects discussed in the seminar.
