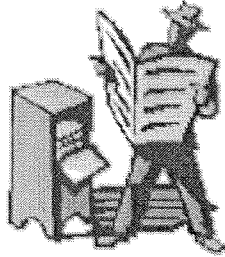


CAREERS IN FIRST AMENDMENT AND MEDIA LAW

David E. McCraw is Vice President and Assistant General Counsel of The New York Times Company. He has been at The Times since 2002. Mr. McCraw previously was Vice President and Deputy General Counsel of The New York Daily News. Prior to that, he was a litigation associate at Clifford Chance and Rogers & Wells and a clerk to Judge Richard Simons of the New York State Court of Appeals. He holds a Bachelor's degree in Journalism from the University of Illinois, a Master's degree in Communications from Cornell University, and a law degree from Albany Law School.

Stephanie S. Abrutyn is currently Senior Counsel, Litigation, at Home Box Office, Inc. ("HBO"), where she represents HBO in a variety of legal matters with an emphasis on content-based issues arising from HBO Original Programming, HBO Films, and HBO Sports and Documentary programming. Prior to joining HBO, Ms. Abrutyn served as Senior Counsel/East Coast Media for Tribune Company, where she regularly counseled and represented journalists from six of Tribune's daily newspapers, including *Newsday*, *The Hartford Courant*, and *The Baltimore Sun*. Ms. Abrutyn's experience also includes working as an attorney in the Litigation and Employment Practices group of ABC, and as a member of the Media and Communications Practice Team in the Washington, D.C., office of the law firm of Baker & Hostetler.

Jonathan Donnellan is Senior Counsel at Hearst Corporation, responsible for litigation and in matters regarding First Amendment and Media Law. He holds a B.A., *magna cum laude*, from New York University, and a J.D. from New York University. Previously, Mr. Donnellan has been Vice President and Deputy General Counsel, Daily News LP, 2002-2003; an Assistant General Counsel for Cable News Network (CNN), 2001-2002; and a Litigation Associate at Cahill, Gordon & Reindel, from 1991-2001.

Lynn Oberlander has been the General Counsel of *The New Yorker* since November 2006, where she is responsible for the legal matters for the magazine and related businesses, including both content and business-side issues such as pre-publication review, claim resolution, libel and access litigation, newsgathering, Freedom of Information Act requests and sweepstakes and promotions. From 2001 through 2006, she was the Editorial Counsel at Forbes, where she was responsible for all content-related matters for the magazine, its international editions, and its internet site Forbes.com. Prior to joining Forbes, Ms. Oberlander was senior media counsel at NBC, working with the local and network news divisions on a wide variety of pre-broadcast and newsgathering issues. After clerking for the Hon. John H. Pratt of the U.S. District Court for the District of Columbia in 1991-1992, Ms. Oberlander began her legal career at Paul, Weiss, Rifkind, Wharton & Garrison. She received her B.A., *cum laude*, from Yale College, and her J.D. from Columbia Law School, where she was an editor of the Law Review and a Harlan Fiske Stone Scholar. Ms. Oberlander teaches a graduate course in Media, Corporate Responsibility, and the Law, both in a traditional classroom setting and on-line, at The New School in New York. She is a member of the Communications and Media Law Committee of the New York State Bar Association and an active participant in the Communications and Media Law Committee of the New York City Bar Association.
